Sir, Being personally acquainted with you I have taken the liberty to enclose you the within P. of Atto.
If I am entitled to the land be pleased to enclose me the Pattent or warrant to Rockcastle County, Mount
Vernon Kentucky. With high respect your Obe friend

I William Sexton resident of Whitly [sic: Whitley] County Kentucky a private Soldier in the Revolutionary
War, in the Company commanded by Captain William Harbert in the seventh Regiment in the line of the
State of Virginia on Continental establishment do state upon Oath, that I have not, nor has any person for
me, either by Power of Attorney, Conveyence or otherwise ever received from the State of Virginia the
land due me by said State for my services as aforesaid as a Revolutionary Soldier to have been located
North West of of the River Ohio: William hisXmark Sexton

Sworn and subscribed to before me a Justice of the peace for Whitly County Kentucky this the third day
of July 1827 Jas. K. Gallion JPWC

I the above named William Sexton, do hereby Constitute and appoint the Govenor of the State of Virginia
my true & lawful attorney for me & in my name to demand and receive of the State of Virginia any
warrant or warrants that may be due or coming to me for land, for services performed in the Revolutionary
War. Given under my hand this 3 day of July 1827. William hisXmark Sexton
