


William Sharp appeared before me a Justice of the Peace for said County and made Oath that he served with Thomas Sharp in the Revolutionary war, and that he knows said Thomas Sharp enlisted in Capt. Hungerfords company of the 10<sup>th</sup> Virginia Regiment commanded by Col. Stark in the Spring 1778 for during the war and that said Thomas Sharp did serve during the war in said Regiment and in the [part may be missing at bottom of page] in the Virginia continental line. And that about the end of the war said Thomas Sharp died in the state of Virginia in Fredericksburg.

This day personally appeared before me a Justice of the peace for the County afors'd William Sharp who made oath that he Enlisted in the Spring of the year 1778 in Capt Hungerfords Company in the 10<sup>th</sup> Virginia Reg't on Continental establishment Commanded by Col Stark for during the War, and continued to serve in s'd Regiment or in the service of the United States until peace was made after the Capture of Cornwallace [sic: Cornwallis, 19 Oct 1781], who he assisted in taking when he was discharged with the other troops at the siege. That he is now drawing a Pension from the United States for his said services; And that he has never received his Land warrant from the State of Virginia, and now prays that the Governor and Council of Virginia will grant him his Land warrant for his said services, sworn to before me this [?] day of Septemb'r 1820



This day personally appeared before me a Justice of the peace for the County afors'd John Sharp [S30702] who made oath he well knows the within named William Sharp, who makes the above Declaration, and he also knows that Mr. Sharp enlisted in the year 1778 in Capt Hungerfords Company in the 10<sup>th</sup> Virginia Reg't Commanded by Col Stark on Continental Establishment for during the war, and that he continued to serve in said Reg't or in the service of the United States until the conclusion of Peace after the Capture of Lord Cornwallace, when he was discharged with the other troops

NOTE: I could find no record of a Capt. Hungerford or Col. Stark in the Virginia Continental Line. Nor could I find a federal pension application for a William Sharpe or Sharp who served in the 10<sup>th</sup> Virginia Continental Regiment.
