


Southern Campaign American Revolution Pension Statements and Rosters

Virginia documents pertaining to Patrick Stewart VAS4496

The affidavit of Leonard Shackelford [S6085] of the County of King and Queen and State of Virginia The affiant being first duly sworn according to law, states upon his oath, that he is a Revolutionary Pensioner going on seventy six years old, and that he was intimately acquainted with Patrick Stewart late of the County of King and Queen, and State of Va. that the said Stewart and himself were close neighbours both before and after the Revolutionary War, and that the said Stewart enlisted in that war with him the said Shackelford some time in the year 1776 or 7 under Capt Gregory Smith, for two years in the State service which time the said Stewart served faithfully out, and afterwards enlisted again in the Continental line, for during the war, and under what officers, or in what Regiment he does not now recollect, but well remembers that the said Stewart was in Gen'l Woodfords [William Woodford] Brigade, and was a Bowman for him the said Woodford; that the said Stewart was taken prisoner together with Gen'l Woodford somewhere to the South, he thinks in South Carolina, and the said Stewart remained a prisoner he thinks not less than three years, when he finally came home upon parole, and further this affiant saith not
