The deposition of Henry Buchanan [S37807] who says he was well acquainted with John Stubbs of Gloucester County and that said John Stubbs was a Lieutenant in the Virginia State Navy in the revolutionary war on board of the Henry Gally commanded by Capt'n Robert Tompkins [R102] and that the said Stubbs served till the vessel was laid up and dismantled in the year 1781 and that he never resigned his station As Witness my hand and seal this 16th day of February 1837
