I certify that Bowdoin Snead [W4810] who is a man of truth & veracity & entitled to full confidence in all his statements & who is upwards of 72 years of age came before me & made oath that Preson Snead entered the service of the United States with his brother George Snead [W7839] & returned with said George Snead – that he (the Witness) does not know positively the length of time said Preson Snead was absent & in service, but has no doubt it was more than three years – that George Snead drew his warrant for Bounty Land for his service & that George Snead & Preson Snead served the same length of time. Witness my hand & Seal this 20<sup>th</sup> day of September 1832 at Accomack County. Wm. R. Custis J.P.

I certify that Robert Russell sen'r [W5753] aged about 72 years & who is a credible witness & is reputed to have been a Revolutionary soldier & believed to have been such, came before me & made oath that he served in the 9<sup>th</sup> Virginia Regiment in the Revolutionary War – that Preson Snead served as a Serjeant [the rest missing]
