


Southern Campaign American Revolution Pension Statements and Rosters

Virginia documents pertaining to Thomas Snead VAS4586  
Transcribed and annotated by C. Leon Harris.

[From bounty-land records in the Library of Virginia.]

I do hereby certify that Major Thomas Snead, formerly of the 11<sup>th</sup> Virginia regiment on Continental establishment, entered the service in the county of Accomack, at the commencement of the Revolutionary war, the latter part of the year 1775, or beginning of the year 1776; that I served myself two campaigns with him to the Northward, that he was a brave and distinguished officer; that I believe he resigned his commission at the end of the campaign 1778, but whether he resigned at that time, or resigned at all, I cannot positively say.



I was very well acquainted with Major Thomas Snead both in 1777 & 1778. I do not recollect with precision at what time he left the army, but think it was about the close of the campaign of 1778. I have some vague idea that he was a supernumerary Major, but my recollection on this point is too indistinct to be in any degree relied on even by myself. I know he was Major in 1777, at the battle of Brandywine [11 Sep 1777] J Marshall [John Marshall S5731]
