These are to Certifie that the Bearer hereof Littlebury Stanback Enlisted in the Navy of this State under my  
Command the 4<sup>th</sup> day April 1777 and Served the time of three years as an able Seaman

Given under my hand the 1<sup>st</sup> day Jan'y 1784

I William Jennings aged 80 years do hereby certify that I was acquainted with Littleberry Stanback, and  
knows that he enlisted during the year 1778 in the state service during the Revolutionary war, under Capt.  
Rich'd Barron (who commanded the schooner Patriot, for three years, and continued in service during the  
period of his enlistment, after which he returned to the county of Prince George and lived until he died,  
that the said Stanback was in the engagement at the that Commodore Taylor, rec'd a wound in one of his  
thighs which was broken, by a musket ball, and that he was in several other engagements with myself,  
some of which was successful
