I do here by Certify, that Anthony Talley was enlisted as a soldier for three years in the first Virginia Reg't while we layed at Robinsons farm on the North River [in New York], in the fall of the year 1779, he the said Talleys time of of service being nearly expired, the said Anthony Talley enlisted with me for dureing the war, in the following year about the first of January while we were Building Huts at morris Town [Morristown NJ] the Virginia Line was ordered to Charles Town [Charleston SC] for the defence of that City, in May following we surrendereed prisoners of war, – in the Summer of said year Talley and many other [illegible word] brave soldiers[?] were thrown into a prison Ship to Compell them to enlist into the British Service there the said Talley got Joal [Jail] fever, and was reduced verry low, at the time of our exchange, on our passage from Charles Town to James Town in Virginia [summer 1781], he the s'd Tally dec[ease]d at Sea, – the Rever[en]d Charles Talley is the only one of the Brothers who is alive neither of the other Brothers had Issue, Given from under my Hand the first day of September 1815
