I do certify that I knew William Terrill as a Lieutenant in the army of the united States 6th Virginia Regiment on continental establishment. I know He was in the Service in March 1776 and I know He was in Service when the army went to the south in the fall of the year 1779 Given under my hand this 5th day of August 1808.

I do hereby Certify that it appears from the books in this office that William Terrell a Lieutenant drew on the 17th October 1782 ninety eight pounds eighteen shillings and six pence the balance of his full pay in the Continental establishment.
