
Nelson County November Court 1818

It is ordered that it be certified that satisfactory proof was this day produced to the Court that Reuben Thomas enlisted as first Seargeant in the Autumn of 1776 for three years in a Company under the command of Capt James Franklin [VAS3633] in the Virginia Continental establishment and that the said Reuben was killed in the service before his time had expired and that Edward Thomas Jesse Thomas Rebecca Thomas (at present wife to Joseph Thomas) and Evy Thomas (half sister being sister by the mothers side only) and at present married to John Pattison and Polly Thomas (half Sister being a sister by the Mothers side only at present married to Thomas Tindall are the only heirs and Representatives of the said Reuben Thomas and that no Compensation has been received for the service of the said Reuben Thomas

I do hereby certify that the within order of the Court of Nelson is correct as it Respects Mr. Thomas' being a Soldier in the Revolutionary War, and that he he Died in the service of his Country, Given under my hand this 15th Day Octob'r 1818
