THESE are to CERTIFY that the Bearer hereof Joseph Toole in the first Virginia regiment, having faithfully served the United States from the 20<sup>th</sup> of March 1780 and being inlisted for the war, is hereby discharged from the American army.

Given at the war office the 10<sup>th</sup> Day of Feb'y 1784

By order of the secretary at war B Lincoln [Gen. Benjamin Lincoln]



THE within CERTIFICATE shall not avail the bearer as a discharge, until the ratification of the definitive treaty of peace; previous to which time, and until proclamation thereof shall be made, he is to be considered as being on furlough.
