I use speech recognition software to make all my transcriptions. Such software misinterprets my southern accent with unfortunate regularity and my poor proofreading fails to catch all misinterpretations. Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8th of June 1786." I William Connor certify that Solomon Malbone was a Soldier of the revolutionary War, that he served in Augustus Tabbs [Augustine Tabb's] company upwards of five years, and was honorably discharged at the end of the war. Given under my hand this 3rd of July 1832
