[Methodology: Spelling, punctuation and/or grammar have been corrected in some instances for ease of reading and to facilitate searches of the database. Where the meaning is not compromised by adhering to the spelling, punctuation or grammar, no change has been made. Corrections or additional notes have been inserted within brackets or footnotes. Blanks appearing in the transcripts reflect blanks in the original. A bracketed question mark indicates that the word or words preceding it represent(s) a guess by me. Only materials pertinent to the military service of the veteran and to contemporary events have been transcribed. Affidavits that provide additional information on these events are included and genealogical information is abstracted, while standard, 'boilerplate' affidavits and attestations related solely to the application, and later nineteenth and twentieth century research requests for information have been omitted. I use speech recognition software to make all my transcriptions. Such software misinterprets my southern accent with unfortunate regularity and my poor proofreading fails to catch all misinterpretations. Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8th of June 1786." Please call errors or omissions to my attention.]

Captain Philip Mallory has drawn warrant for 4000 acres – Certificate says "for service from the 22nd of November 1776 to the present time." And is dated 31 December 1782

We do certify that Phillip Malory was a Captain in the Virginia line on Continental establishment in the revolutionary war and that he served to the end of the war.



I do hereby certify that Philip Mallory Esquire of Fauquier County was appointed a Lieutenant in the 15th Virginia Regiment on Continental Establishment the first day of December 1776 & that he served until the peace took place which was in November 1783
