This is to Certify that we George Suggs [S38320] & John Singleton [VAS4460], of the Borough of Norfolk, State of Virginia, were Soldiers of the Revolutionary war and in the Continental Service and that we were personally acquainted with James Willoughby, from this Borough, that to our own knowledge, he was Slain in battle at Brandywine State of Delaware [sic: Pennsylvania, 11 Sep 1777], in the month of September One thousand seven hundred and seventy seven and that he was a Sergeant in Capt. Wm Grimes [William Grimes VAS1713] (Company, Alias Capt. Lewis; belonging to the 15 regt Commanded by Colo Innis [James Innes VAS1344] and we do further certify that James Willoughby of this Borough is the nephew & Heir at law of the said Deceased. At witness our hand & seal, at Norfolk this fourteenth day of April One thousand eight hundred & eighteen
