North'd [Northumberland] County State of Virginia towit  
Deposition of Margret Berry taken this the 10<sup>th</sup> day of July 1831. This deponant personally appeared before me one of the Commonwealths Justices for the County aforesaid & deposeth & saith upon Oath that George Walker of the aforesaid County did enlist under Edward Hull of s'd County during the revolutionary war for the term of three years which was soon after the commencement of the war & that s'd George Walker did serve the time for which he enlisted & received a honourable discharge.  
Given under my hand & seal/ Edw'd Coles

This is to Certify, That it appears from a List in this Office of such Officers and Soldiers of the Virginia Continental Line, during the Revolutionary War, as settled their Accounts, and received Certificates for the balance of their Full Pay, according to an Act of Assembly, passed the November Session, 1781, that a Certificate issued on the 22<sup>d</sup> day of May 1784, in the name of George Walker as Matross of artillery for £71.0.0, which Certificate appears to have been delivered to Colo. Hull.
