
Virginia documents pertaining to Nehemiah Walker VAS4845

I do certify, that Nehemiah Walker enlisted in Capt. Thomas Snead's [VAS4586] company, of the 9<sup>th</sup> Virginia Regiment, the beginning of the year 1776, or thereabout, that he marched in that regiment a soldier, in December 1776, and that he joined the American army at Princeton, which was under the command of General Washington – that I knew the said Walker [two undeciphered lines] at the battle of Germantown [4 Oct 1777] and [undeciphered] New Jersey.

Given under my hand in Accomack county Virginia, the 4<sup>th</sup> day of December 1819.

May 8 1820      Personally appeared before me John Custis one of the Commonwealths Justices of the Peace for s'd County of Accomack William Rolly of lawfull age & made Oath on the holy Evangelist of Almighty [God] that he well knows Leveson[?] East to be the Son [of] Sabrough East who was the Aunt of Nemiah Wal[ker] and believes that he is now his only Heir.      John Custis
