January 31 To Cash advance you for the recruiting service

April 2 By Sundry Disbursements in the Recruiting service

April 2 To Warrant the balance of this amount

Thursday 4th [undeciphered] 1776

A Warrant to Capt. Thos. Walker £5.4.0 for a Rifle [undeciphered] comp.

Princess Anne County towit

Personally appeared before me a Justice of the peace for the County aforesaid, in the state of Virginia Malachi Carroll of the Said County and made oath that Thomas Walker was a Captain in the Virginia State line during the war of the Revolution, and was in service and held his commission as such until the end of the war.

I certify that the said Malachi Carroll is a person of Credit. Given under my hand this 24th day of
May 1831. Jesse Morris jr. J.P.

Princess Ann County to wit

This day William Cannon Personally appeared before a Justice of the peace for the County of Princess Ann and state of Virginia who did make oath that Thos. Walker was a Captain in the Virginia state line during the war of the revolution and continued in service untill the close of the War and I certify that the said William Cannon is worthy of credit Given under my hand and seal this 5th of Nov'r
1831. Jon Hunter J.P.

Advised that this claim be rejected, because his name does not appear upon the Army Register.

NOTE: Compare this officer with Capt. Thomas Walker R18767. The first two items transcribed above apparently pertain to a different Capt. Thomas Walker of the 9th Virginia Continental Regiment, who raised a company from Albemarle County. According to William Burch W27940, that Capt. Walker resigned.
