THESE are to CERTIFY that the bearer hereof in the Stacy Wilson Sargeant regiment, having fatihfully served the United States Seven years and being inlisted for the war, is hereby discharged from the American army.

Given at the war office the 27th day of June 1783

By order of the Secretary at war, B Lincoln

Jos. [undecipehered] Sec'y

Registered in the books of the regiment,

War office, June 27 1783.

THE within CERTIFICATE shall not avail the bearer as a discharge, until the ratification of the definitive treaty of peace, previous to which time, and until proclamaion thereof shall be made, he is to be considered as being on furlough.

This is to Certify that Stacy Wilson Inlisted in the Contennelital army Second Verginny Reg't October 2nd year 1776 and has faithfully serv'd this Day June 28th in the year 1783.
