State of North Carolina } Personally came Samuel Blankinship of said County before me  
Iredell County } James Campbell one of the Justices of the Peace in and for said County  
and made Oath in due form of Law that he is well acquainted with John Wallis and has been so for many  
years. That during the time of the Revolutionary War he lived within 15 or 20 miles of said Wallis & had  
went to school with him when both of them were boys, that he understood that Wallis enlisted into the  
Virginia Line of Continental troops, that deponent saw Wallis once after it was said he had enlisted on a  
furlough, that this deponent was informed & verily believes the said Wallis remained in the service of the  
Country for upwards of three years, and further this deponent saith not.
