

I do hereby certify that I knew Doct. Walter Warfield of the Virginia Continental Line in the Revolution. When called on a short time ago, my remembrance respecting him was not very distinct but I now well remember him – he was a surgeon to one of our Reg'ts (but which one I do not recollect) and was in service at the end of the war, but I do not know how long he had served. Given under my hand this 5 Sept 182[?]

I do certify that I knew Dr. Walter Warfield of the Va. Continental Line. He was surgeon to one of the Virginia Cont Reg'ts but I do not recollect the number – he was in service at the end of the war. given under my hand this 16 Sept 1822.

The Claim of Dr. Walter Warfield.

It is proved that he was Surgeon to one of the Va. Cont. Reg'ts. at the end of the war.

He was a man of great wealth & moved to Kentucky many years ago & has never rec'd. his bounty land. His not serving three years is no ban to his claim – being in service at the end of the war. The construction given by the Executive to the Law of 1782 2 vol. A code page 395 – giving bounty to those officers who had served 3 years – being that this law did not limit any rights given by the law of 1779, page 378 same book – but only provided for officers who had served 3 years, and who could not have rec'd. under the former laws unless they were in service at the end of the war even altho they may have served 7 years.
