To the Gov'r & Council of Va.

The Heirs of Stephen Warrington who was a Quarter Master in the Virginia State Navy in the Revolutionary war. Respectfully submit their application for Bounty Land which would long since have been submitted but from the fact that not untill very recently they have been able to find his Settlements for his services and Grade of office, which you will find from the enclosed certificate amounting to £106.3.3 delivered to Col. Cropper [John Cropper W3781] for a ballance due said Warrington from 1<sup>s</sup> day of January 1777 to 31<sup>s</sup> December 1781 a period of more than three years which is proof conclusive that his grade of office was that of Quarter Master at the Conclusion of his services, & the am't. of Pay being larger than that paid to a Seaman is conclusive evidence of his being a warrant officer and served untill she was laid up and thereby became supernumary [supernumerary].
