THIS is to certify that John Wash a private in the grenadiers in the First Partisan Legion, under my Command has served faithfully & bravely to this Day, is hereby discharged from the Service of the United States, in Pursuance of Orders received from the Commander in Chief, bearing Date the third instant.

I farther certify that John Wash a private in the grenadiers having been inlisted in the state of Virginia is intituled by the Resolution of Congress, of the [illegible] February, 1779, to the Benefits [two illegible lines]

To all whom it may concern know ye that I John Wash now of the County of Montgomery have made, ordained, & by these presents do make & ordain constitute & appoint John Taylor Gent of s'd County my true & lawfull attorney for me & in my name, to settle with & [illegible] from the Auditor of Public Accounts my certificate of pay for my services in the last war, & also draw from the Treasury the money that shall be due on s'd Certificate giving & granting unto my s'd Attorney full power & authority in & touching the premises. And do hereby ratify & confer in whatsoever my s'd Attorney shall legally do herein. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this 18<sup>th</sup> day of May 1788
