[The following is from the file of a different Thomas Watts (VAS4906).]

This is to Certify, That it appears from a List in this Office of such Officers and Soldiers of the Virginia State Line, during the Revolutionary War, as settled their Accounts, and received Certificates for the balance of their Full Pay, according to an Act of Assembly, passed the November Session, 1781, that a Certificate issued on the 24th day of November 1783, in the name of Thomas Watts as a Lieut of Infantry for £155.9.2, which Certificate appears to have been delivered to Mr. [undeciphered] and was given for services prior to the 1st January, 1782.

Given under my hand at the Auditor's Office, Richmond, this 13th day of December 1833.

I Certify that I was well acquainted with Lieutenant Thos Watts of the Virginia state line under Col Dabney [Charles Dabney R13624] in the revolutionary war and that he served dureing the war and he was Honourably discharged as Witness my hand and seal this the 26th day of May 1833
