

State of Virginia } to wit
County of Mathews }

Personally appeared before me a Justice of the Peace for the foregoing County John Morgan [S5777] and William Digges [S8327] and made oath that Digges Weston of that part of Gloucester County which was called Kingston Parish and now constitutes Mathews County he enlisted on the 7th day of February in the year 1776 in the United States Service under Capt. Charles Tompkies [W6304] for the term of two years and served his tour to the North with said John Morgan, that said Tompkies did not go out with the men he had enlisted and his first Lieutenant Reuben Lipscomb [VAS950] went out with them, at the Valley Forge in the state of Pennsylvania, Digges Weston after his first term had expired enlisted again in a Company of Horse for what length of time these witnesses do not know but they think it must have been for the period of the War – he went out and did not return as they verily beleive until after the War had ended – and further they say not.
