
Virginia documents pertaining to Isham Whitt VAS4948

[From [bounty-land records in the Library of Virginia](#) indexed as White, Isham. The name Isham Whitt appears on muster rolls of Capt. James Foster's company of the 15<sup>th</sup> Virginia Continental Regiment. Foster's company was raised in Amelia County.]


I do hereby certifi that Isham Whitt served in the fifteenth regiment as a private soldier in the Virginia line on Continental establishment and that I saw him in the same Regiment a short time before the battle at Brandywine [11 Sep 1777]. Given under my hand this 27<sup>th</sup> day January 1808.
