I certify that Robert Russell Sen'r [W5753] a Revolutionary pensioner & a man of truth & veracity made oath before me that Waitman Willitt of this County enlisted in Thomas Sneads [Thomas Snead VAS4586] Company in the 9<sup>th</sup> Va Reg't Cont'l line for the term of during the War & was killed at the battle of Germantown [4 Oct 1777] in which battle he the witness was taken prisoner. Given under my hand & seal as Justice of the peace in & for said County this 21<sup>st</sup> day of January 1834.

Hilary Mears [Hillary Mears S18508] a Revolutionary pensioner & a man of truth & veracity came before me & made oath that Waitman Willitt of this County enlisted in Capt Thos. Sneads Company in the 9<sup>th</sup> Va Regt. Cont'l. line for the term of during the War & was killed in the battle of Germantown. Given under my hand & seal as a Justice of the peace in & for the County of Accomack this 21<sup>st</sup> day of January 1834.

I certify that Severn Scott [S38355] a Revolutionary pension & a man of truth & veracity came before me & made oath that Waitman Willitt of this County enlisted in Capt Thomas Sneads Company 9<sup>th</sup> Va Regt Cont'l. line for the term of during the War & was killed in the battle of Germantown. Given under my hand & seal as a Justice of the peace for Accomack Co this 21<sup>st</sup> day of January 1834.
