Virginia Princess Anne County to wit”

This day Maliki Carrell [sic: Malachi Carroll S8180] who is personally & well known to me to be a man of respectability & entitled to credit, personally appeared before me one of the Commonwealths Justices of the peace for the County aforesaid and made Oath, that Arthur Williams was well known to him, that they served in the revolutionary War together, that the said Arthur Williams enlisted as a cavalry soldier under the command of Captain Ballard, that he served to the full end of the three years, when the term of enlistment had expired, he reenlisted for and during the war, & served untill the end of the War. Given under my hand and seal as Justice of the peace for the Coty aforesaid this 7 day of May 1832.

This is to Certify, That it appears from a List in this Office of such Officers and Soldiers of the Virginia Continental Line, during the Revolutionary War, as settled their Accounts, and received Certificates for the balance of their Full Pay, according to an Act of Assembly, passed the November Session, 1781, that a Certificate issued on the 15th day of November 1783, in the name of Arthur Williams as a Soldier of infantry for £35.5, which Certificate appears to have been delivered to Wm. Johnson.
