This is to Certify that Launce Lot Williamson of the State Garrison Regement Inlisted July 1778 & served
tell July 81.

Richmond Ap'1 25th 1783 D. Mann Lt [David Mann]

The affidavit of James Bullifant [S39236] taken before me Jas. H. Christian a Justice of the peace of the
County of Charles City, State of Virginia, at the Court House of said County this 18th of July 1833. The
affiant being first duly sworn on the evangelists of almighty God deposes That Launcelot Williamson
enlisted as a common soldier in the State garrison Regiment of Virginia, commanded by Colo. Porterfield
[Charles Porterfield BLWt1145-450], and in the company commanded by Captn Drew [Thomas H. Drew
R13852] for three years, and that he served out the whole time of his enlistment, viz. three years. That he
knew said Williamson well and knows of his own knowledge that he did enlist & serve for three years as
beforesaid.
