

I Certify to the Register of the Land Office that Lieutenant Willis Willson of the Eleventh Virginia Continental Regiment is entitled to his Bounty for Lands as a Lieutenant for three years service to be Computed from the second day of July 1779. Wm Davis  
Warrant for 2666 $\frac{2}{3}$  Acr's Issued 15<sup>th</sup> Aug't 1782

Richmond December 13<sup>th</sup> 1808.

I hereby certify the Willis Willson Esq'r entered the service of the United States in the continental army in the month of February of the year one thousand seven hundred and seventy seven and continued therein untill the close of the revolutionary war at which period he bore the rank of a Lieutenant of Infantry in the eleventh regiment of the Virginia line.
