

Southern Campaign American Revolution Pension Statements and Rosters

Virginia documents pertaining to Edward Wise VAS5053

Severn Scott [S38355] a Revolutionary pensioner & a man of truth & veracity made oath before me that he enlisted in Capt Thos Sneads [Thomas Snead VAS4586] Company of the 9<sup>th</sup> Va Reg't. Cont'l. line for two years & was discharged at Camp Valley forge in Pennsylvania early in 1778 & returned home – that Edward Wise of Accomack County served in the same company for the same period with the Witness & then reenlisted either for 3 year or for the War & remained several years in service but the Witness cannot say positively that he served till the war ended – but thinks he did

Levin Hyslop [W7858] a Revolutionary pensioner & a man of truth & veracity made oath before [illegible] in Capt Blairs [John Blair VAS2518] Company of the 9<sup>th</sup> Va Reg't Cont'l. line for 18 months & then reenlisted for the War & served till the War ended & has drawn 200 acres of land for his services – that he well recollects Edward Wise of the same County who enlisted in Capt Sneads Company & served in the same Reg't & that s'd Wise was in service several years after his first enlistment expired.

I certify that Robert Russell sen'r. [W5753] a Revolutionary pensioner & a man of truth & veracity came before me & made oath that he served in Capt Thomas Sneads Company of the Cont'l. line & was captured at Germantown & imprisoned at Philadelphia – that he was well acquainted with Edward Wise of the same place who entered said Company when it was first raised & after going to N Jersey reenlisted for three years & served out that period & was discharged.  
Given under my hand & seal as a justice of the peace in & for the County of Accomack this 21<sup>st</sup> day of January 1834.
