

I William Stroud [S6166] of the City of Williamsburg being now in my Eighty first year of age Doth certify that I was well acquainted with Mathew Wood who acted as a fife major in the army of the revolution and that he belonged either to the companies of Capt'n Thos Nelson [Thomas Nelson] or Dickinson [Edmund B. Dickinson BLWt523-400] and I was frequently with him during the war until he went to the North and saw him frequently after he returned, and to the best of my belief he served during the whole of the war but I am perfectly satisfied he served three years in succession and that he was honorably discharged. As Witness my hand and seal this 25th day of July 1832.



I William Stroud being now in my 81st year of age do cirtefy that I was well acquainted with Matthew Wood who was a fife major in the Revolutionary war and to the best of my knowledge & belief he served for the space of three years successively that he enlistedd sometime in the year 1775 under Capt'n. Thos. Nelson of York Town The deponent further states that he believes he served from the period of enlistment to the end of the war.

I Henry Buchanan [S37807] of the state and County aforesaid being now in my 72nd year of age do hereby Certify that I was personally acquainted with Matthew Wood who was a fife Major in the Revolutionary war in the continental service; That he enlisted & went into service about the last of the year 177[?] under Capt Thos. Nelson in the first Virginia Regiment of Infantry commanded by Colo Green [John Green BLWt866-500] & that he served for the space of three years.
