Virginia Pension Application of William Courtney VAS560

Know all men by these presents that I William Courtney a lame Soldier from a wound received in the late War, hereby appoint & constitute Mr James Dondrell[?] of this County of Stafford my true and lawfull Attorney [the rest is largely illegible in the online image and appears to be standard form for a power of attorney]
William hisXmark Courtney

Wm. Courtney was allowed by an act of Assembly passed in the Octo. Sess. 1790 Twelve Pounds pr annum for life. There are now two years pension due to him amounting to £24; If the County Court of Stafford will be pleased to direct the public collector to pay him that sum, out of any collection, the Sheriff shall have credit here for that amount bringing the Order of Court & the Pensioners Receipt
