

[Methodology: Spelling, punctuation and/or grammar have been corrected in some instances for ease of reading and to facilitate searches of the database. Where the meaning is not compromised by adhering to the spelling, punctuation or grammar, no change has been made. Corrections or additional notes have been inserted within brackets or footnotes. Blanks appearing in the transcripts reflect blanks in the original. A bracketed question mark indicates that the word or words preceding it represent(s) a guess by me. The word 'illegible' or 'indcipherable' appearing in brackets indicates that at the time I made the transcription, I was unable to decipher the word or phrase in question. Only materials pertinent to the military service of the veteran and to contemporary events have been transcribed. Affidavits that provide additional information on these events are included and genealogical information is abstracted, while standard, 'boilerplate' affidavits and attestations related solely to the application, and later nineteenth and twentieth century research requests for information have been omitted. I use speech recognition software to make all my transcriptions. Such software misinterprets my southern accent with unfortunate regularity and my poor proofreading skills fail to catch all misinterpretations. Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8<sup>th</sup> of June 1786." Please call material errors or omissions to my attention.]

I hereby Certify that Enamias McDaniel enlisted into my Company of Continental infantry of the Virginia line sometime in the month of December 1776 for the term of three years, and lost his life in the service to the best of my recollection about August 1777. Given under my hand at Hanover April the 6<sup>th</sup> 1793




At a Court continued and held for Hanover County on Wednesday the 9<sup>th</sup> of March 1791 Lucy Lambeth (late Lucy McDaniel widow of Enamias McDaniel) exhibited her pension Certificate and made oath thereto according to law, which Certificate is ordered to be recorded and Ordered that the Sure of, out of the public money in his hands, to pay her the sum of 6 pounds, the allowance mentioned in said Certificate, according to the law, which Certificate is in these words, to wit,

*"I do with the advice of Counsel, hereby certify, that Lucy McDaniel who is the widow of Enamias McDaniel, late a Private in the 4<sup>th</sup> Virginia Regiment and who died in the service of the United States, is put on the List of pensioners with an allowance of Six pounds per annum commencing the first day of January 1790.*

Given under my hand as Governor of the Commonwealth of Virginia, at Richmond, this 13<sup>th</sup> day of July 1790.

The Petition of John Lambeth humbly Sheweth; That your Petitioner sometime in the year 1792 intermarried with a certain Lucy McDaniel, who was then on the pension list, – that in consequence of said marriage, the pension was discontinued.

Your Petitioner, further states, that the situation of the said Lucy is not made better by the


aforesaid marriage, that he is old and infirm: and unable to procure a livelihood. He therefore, humbly hopes that your honorable body will take the case into consideration and grant such relief as the nature of it requires. And your petitioner as in duty bound will ever pray &c


