Virginia Bounty-Land Application of Henry Crook VAS618
Transcribed and annotated by C. Leon Harris

I do Certify that Henry Crook inlisted with me as a soldier in the Virginia line on Continental establishment for three years, on the 16th December 1782 that he served faithfully in the said Line untill discharged at the point of Fork [confluence of James and Rivanna rivers], I think sometime in the month of October 1783 at the period of the dissolution of the said Line – and that he was at the time of his inlisting, a Citizen of Berkeley County Virginia; that the said Henry Crook is the same person who Executed a power of Attorney to Andrew Dunscomb dated the 13th day of November 1799 to which, George Hite, Owen Gwathney and my self are Witnesses, and acknowledged before Abraham Shepherd [pension application W19343], to which Power of Attorney this Certificate is anexed, that the said Henry Crook is now about thirty five years of Age, five feet Eight Inches high, Grey Eyes, Brown Hair,

I do Certify that Henry Crook who Executed and acknowledges the power of Attorney hereto anexed before me on the 13th day of November last is the same Henry Crook who was inlisted by Henry Bedinger at Shepherds Town some time in the year 1782 for the Virginia line that he was at that time one of my Neighbors sons, whose Father Jacob Crook is since Dead. that the said Henry, is about 35 years of Age, well made Grey Eyes Brown Hair, & Brown Complexion.
