Pension application of Francis Miller VAS677 Transcribed by Will Graves vsl 5VA 6/5/13

Where the meaning is not compromised by adhering to the spelling, punctuation or grammar, no change has been made. Corrections or additional notes have been inserted within brackets or footnotes. Blanks appearing in the transcripts reflect blanks in the original. A bracketed question mark indicates that the word or words preceding it represent(s) a guess by me. Only materials pertinent to the military service of the veteran and to contemporary events have been transcribed. Affidavits that provide additional information on these events are included and genealogical information is abstracted, while standard, 'boilerplate' affidavits and attestations related solely to the application, and later nineteenth and twentieth century research requests for information have been omitted. I use speech recognition software to make all my transcriptions. Such software misinterprets my southern accent with unfortunate regularity and my poor proofreading fails to catch all misinterpretations. Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8th of June 1786." Please call errors or omissions to my attention.]

This is to Certify, That it appears from a List in this Office of such Officers and Soldiers of the Virginia State Line, during the Revolutionary War, as settled their Accounts, and received Certificates for the balance of their Full Pay, according to an Act of Assembly, passed the November Session 1781, that a Certificate issued on the 14th day of June 1783, in the name of Francis Miller, as a Soldier of Infantry for £58.4.5, which Certificate appears to have been delivered to himself and was given for services prior to the 1st January 1782.

Given under my hand, at the Auditor's Office, Richmond, this 9th day of May, 1834.

I John Christian¹ of the County of Mathews and State of Virginia do hereby Certify and declare that I was well acquainted with Francis Miller formerly of that part of Gloucester County called Kingston Parish, now constituting Mathews County, the said Francis Miller did enlist under Captain William Smith, afterwards turned over to the State Navy and had the command of one of the small Navy vessels: and served 3 years, as I always understood and believed, as witness my hand and seal this 29th day of April in the year of our Lord 1834.
