I use speech recognition software to make all my transcriptions. Such software misinterprets my southern accent with unfortunate regularity and my poor proofreading fails to catch all misinterpretations. Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8th of June 1786." Please call errors or omissions to my attention.]

This is to certify that James Morgan enlisted a Soldier for the Term of 3 years in the 2nd C: R. commanded by Colonel Spotswood and before the time expired the said Morgan Enlisted for during the War in the said Regiment he died in June 1781.

It is ordered that it be certified to his Excellency the Governor & Honorable privy Council, that Frances Morgan Widow of James Morgan deceased, a Soldier who died in the Continental service, Ann Mathews widow of Owen Mathews deceased a Soldier who died in the State Service – and Ann Hayes Widow of __ Hayes a soldier who died in the Continental Service, all continue on the list of Pensioners by order of Court.

I do Certify that a [indecipherable interlineation] named Francis Morgan, and Ann Hayes are in very indigent Circumstances, Morgan has one child about eight years old; Hayes seven, three of which [whom] [are] under eleven years both live on Rented land.
