Affidavits that provide additional information on these events are included and genealogical information is abstracted, while standard, 'boilerplate' affidavits and attestations related solely to the application, and later nineteenth and twentieth century research requests for information have been omitted. I use speech recognition software to make all my transcriptions. Such software misinterprets my southern accent with unfortunate regularity and my poor proofreading fails to catch all misinterpretations. Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8th of June 1786." Please call errors or omissions to my attention.]

I Griffith Dickenson¹ of the County of Pittsylvania and State of Virginia do hereby Certified that I was well acquainted with the late David Motley of said County, and know from my own Personal Knowledge that he was a Continental Soldier in the Army of the Revolution that we both Enlisted for Three years, and marched together in the same Company under Captain Thomas Scott, to Savannah Town in Georgia, and served in the 3rd Virginia Regiment, under Colonel McIntosh [Lachlan McIntosh] & others, the time for which we Enlisted, that the said David Motley I expect was honorably discharged from said service: though I do not Recollect of ever seeing his Discharge. And that we traveled together on our return to Virginia in Company with the Captain we last served under while in the Service.
