Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8th of June 1786." I do hereby certify that John Munroe enlisted in the 5^{th} Virginia Regiment in the year 1776 and served as a Sergeant from that time until July 1781
