
Bounty Land Warrant information relating to Duncan Murry [Murry]VAS791 [vsl 1VA](#)

[Methodology: Spelling, punctuation and/or grammar have been corrected in some instances for ease of reading and to facilitate searches of the database. Where the meaning is not compromised by adhering to the spelling, punctuation or grammar, no change has been made. Corrections or additional notes have been inserted within brackets or footnotes. Blanks appearing in the transcripts reflect blanks in the original. A bracketed question mark indicates that the word or words preceding it represent(s) a guess by me. Only materials pertinent to the military service of the veteran and to contemporary events have been transcribed. Affidavits that provide additional information on these events are included and genealogical information is abstracted, while standard, 'boilerplate' affidavits and attestations related solely to the application, and later nineteenth and twentieth century research requests for information have been omitted. I use speech recognition software to make all my transcriptions. Such software misinterprets my southern accent with unfortunate regularity and my poor proofreading fails to catch all misinterpretations. Also, dates or numbers which the software treats as numerals rather than words are not corrected: for example, the software transcribes "the eighth of June one thousand eighty six" as "the 8th of June 1786." Please call errors or omissions to my attention.]

I do hereby Certify that Duncan Murry [sic] served under me as a Soldier for the War until he was wounded at Camdon [Camden, probably the Battle of Camden, August 15-16, 1780]. Given under my hand at Dumfries this 13th May 1783

¹ Ewell is listed in Gwathmey as serving as a Captain in the 1st VA State Regiment and as having served until January 1, 1781. If that information is correct, then the only "Battle of Camden" in which he could have participated would have been the first Battle of Camden.
