<sup>1</sup> Bobby Gilmer Moss, *Roster of South Carolina Patriots in the American Revolution*, Baltimore, Genealogical Publishing Co., Inc., 1983 (hereinafter cited as Moss), p. 987, lists Whiteside as having served as a captain under Col. Edward Lacey for two weeks in June 1779 and under "Col. Winn" (probably Richard Winn), also in 1779.

<sup>2</sup> Richard Richardson (1704-1780) was a backcountry militia officer from the initial conflict at Ninety Six in 1775 until captured at the fall of Charleston on May 12, 1780.

<sup>3</sup> Joseph Brown was a major, possibly under the under of Col. Richard Winn, at Monck's Corner. Moss, p. 109. S12305 (This and subsequent lettered references appearing at the end of endnotes are to pension applications. The absence of such a reference indicates that Moss contains no pension application information for the individual named in the endnote.)

<sup>4</sup> John McCaw served in several battles during 1779-1780. Moss, p. 600.

<sup>5</sup> Robert Gill, Jr., Moss, p. 357 (3<sup>rd</sup> entry).

<sup>6</sup> Samuel Walker, Moss, p. 961 (1<sup>st</sup> entry), but service under Whiteside and Richardson in 1778 is not mentioned. [Samuel Walker S3448](#)

<sup>7</sup> John Mills, Moss, p. 684 (3 possible entries); [John Mills W9194](#); [John Mills S9024](#). Service under Whiteside in 1778 is not mentioned in any of the three entries.

<sup>8</sup> John Latta, Jr., Moss, p. 555, indicates that he was wounded in the left arm in May 1779 in the battle of Tullifiny Hill, but service under Whiteside in 1778 is not mentioned.

<sup>9</sup> No one by this name as spelled is listed in Moss. Moss does list John Wylie who was the sheriff of Camden District from 1777 to 1780. Moss, p. 1016, but service under Whiteside in 1778 is not mentioned.

<sup>10</sup> James McCaughy, Moss, p. 623.

<sup>11</sup> Samuel Neely, Moss, p. 720. Moss does not list service under Whiteside in 1778.

<sup>12</sup> Joseph Steel, Moss, p. 893, but service under Whiteside in 1778 is not mentioned.

<sup>13</sup> James Cooper (1755-1780), Moss, p. 198, died on a prison ship at Charleston after the fall of that city.

<sup>14</sup> Moss lists 7 individuals by this name, none of whom is described as having served under Whiteside.

<sup>15</sup> No one by this name is listed in Moss, but there is a listing for William McConnell who is said to have served 63 days in the militia under Marion in 1782. Moss, p. 606.

<sup>16</sup> No one by this name is listed in Moss, but there is a listing for George Kelsey. Kelsey is not listed as having served under Whiteside in 1778. Moss, p. 525.

<sup>17</sup> James Bishop, Moss, p. 70, but service under Whiteside and/or Richardson is not mentioned.

<sup>18</sup> Nicholas Bishop, Moss, p. 71, [Nicholas Bishop S17847](#).

<sup>19</sup> Elijah Davis, Moss, p. 236, but service in 1778 and service under Whiteside are not mentioned.

<sup>20</sup> Edward Patton, Moss, p. 758, but service in 1778 and service under Whiteside are not mentioned.

<sup>21</sup> John Henry, Moss, p. 438, [John Henry S10826](#).

<sup>22</sup> Thomas Gill, Moss, p. 357, (5<sup>th</sup> entry). Also, the claimant in [Thomas Gill S31061](#) may be the same individual.

<sup>23</sup> Joseph Walker, Moss, p. 960 (1<sup>st</sup> entry).

<sup>24</sup> Thomas Walker, Moss, p. 961, but service in 1778 and service under Whiteside are not mentioned.

<sup>26</sup> No one by this name is listed in Moss, but there are three Williams Morrows listed. Moss, p. 705. None of them are described as having served in 1778 under Whiteside.

<sup>27</sup> Moss lists two Robert McClearys, neither of whom are listed as serving in 1778 under Whiteside.

<sup>28</sup> No one by this name is listed in Moss, but "Samuel Huston" is listed. Moss, p. 478. Huston is simply described in Moss as having served in the militia without reference to time, places or officers. [Samuel Houston W7810](#)
