



NOTES:

In the fall of 1777 Gen. Edward Hand, commander of the Western Department of the American Army, began planning a punitive expedition against Shawnee Indians in the Ohio Territory. This expedition was delayed until Feb 1778 and managed to kill several peaceful Delaware Indians, mainly women and children, earning it the title "Squaw Campaign." It appears that the Monongalia militiamen were not in the Squaw Campaign, however, because many of the officers resigned to protest the prosecution of their Colonel, Zackquil Morgan, for the murder of a Tory prisoner. For details see the endnotes in the pension application of Thomas Gaddis S4292.

Locations of forts:

Fort Pricket: Fort Prickett State Park 3 mi NE of Fairmont in present Monongalia County WV

Scott's Mill Fort: probably on Scotts Run (AKA Scotts Mill Run) opposite Star City, Monongalia County

Fort Statler: on Dunkard Creek in present Monongalia County

Fort Jarret: unknown. Possibly same as Jarard's Fort

Fort Jackson: on Tenmile Creek in present Washington County PA

Fort Lindley: on Tenmile Creek near Prosperity PA

Fort Adkinson: on Tenmile Creek in present Washington County PA

Martin's Fort: on Crooked Run 4 mi NE of Madsville WV in Monongalia County or Greene County PA

Col. Evans Fort: near confluence of Monongahela and Cheat rivers, Point Marion PA
