<sup>1</sup> The most significant battle preceding the date of this return was the Battle of Hobkirk Hill near Camden SC on 25 April 1781.

<sup>2</sup> This MAY be Roger (Rodger) McBride FPA S41846 who filed under the 1818 act, but his statements as to his service don't fit because, according to him, he remained in Delaware until Washington laid siege to Cornwallis at Yorktown; then marched south to join Greene at Camden. Also, he does not claim to have acted as a sergeant. He says he enlisted in the Continentals under Capt. Kane; served under Capt. Buchanan.
