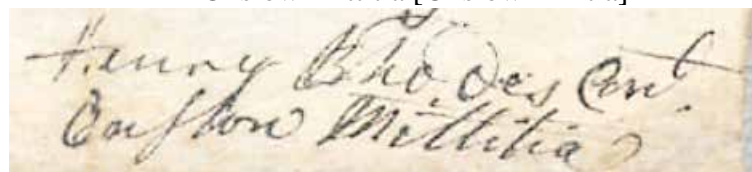

¹ JD Lewis lists both John Boston and Matthew Boston as having served as captains in the Onslow militia commanded by Lt. Col. Henry Rhodes in 1779. See,

² Lewis does not list a captain whose surname was Mitchel or Mitchell who served in the Onslow militia. A search of the pension database, however, identifies Captain George Mitchell (later Lt. Col.) as being from Onslow County.

³ Lewis lists three men surnamed Grant who served as captains in the Onslow militia, to wit: Basil Grant, Reuben Grant and Stu Grant.

⁴ Lewis lists three men surnamed Fox who served as captains in the Onslow militia, to wit: Miles Fox, Moses Fox and William Fox.

⁵ Lewis does not list a captain whose surname was Wharton or Whorton (or any likely variation of spelling) who served in the Onslow militia.

⁶ Lewis does not list a captain whose surname was Yates who served in the Onslow militia. A search of the pension database, however, identifies a Captain Daniel Yates as having been in the Onslow militia.

⁷ Lewis does not list a captain whose surname was Green or Greene who served in the Onslow militia.
