

The above Seventeen Men, have been agreeable to Act of Assembly passed May 10th 1779 enlisted in the County of Craven into the Continental Service by which One hundred and Seventy of the Militia of said County are exempt from Military Duty agreeable to said Act. Given under my hand this 3d day July 1779
