² A veteran by this name filed for a federal pension for his service in the NC militia from Gates County, but he does not mention having served under either Elijah Rhodes or Samuel Jarvis. [Uriah Ure \(Eure\) W19563](#) He says of his service in June 1780 the following:

That he entered the service of the United States under the following named officers and served as herein stated; under Captain John Benton in the 1st Reg't of North Carolina Militia, commanded by Col. [Henry] Dixon as a private soldier in the month of June 1780, for the term of three months, that he marched with his company through North Carolina to Camden South Carolina. The North Carolina militia were commanded by General [Richard] Caswell of that state; the Army by General [Horatio] Gates, that he was at the battle of Camden [16 Aug 1780] called Gates' Defeat, that he retreated with the militia – came back to North Carolina

³ A veteran by this name filed for a federal pension for his service in the NC militia from Gates County, but he does not mention having served under either Elijah Rhodes or Samuel Jarvis. [Samuel Williams S7957](#) He says of his service in June 1780 the following:

That he entered the service as a private of the United States in the month of June 1780 as a substitute for Josiah Grandberry under Capt. John Benton in the 1st Regiment of North Carolina Militia commanded by Col. [Henry] Dixon – that he left the service after serving nearly five months and was discharged honourably at the Shallow Ford on the Yadkin River from whence he returned home – that he resided in Gates County No Ca when he entered the service, that while on this tour of duty he was in the battle in which [Gen. Horatio] Gates was defeated [Battle of Camden, 16 Aug 1780] in which battle the Captain (John Benton) & Lieutenant (James Smith) & about 10 men of his company were killed.
