undated letter from the Veterans Administration in Washington, D.C. to the North Carolina Historical Society contains the following regarding Joshua Hadley:

"Joshua Hadley, 1st Lieutenant 1st, April 1776, N.C. 6th.

Transferred 1st, N.C. 1st, Jan. 1778 [last digit is typed over and unclear]

Captain, 13th, June 1779, Wounded at Eutaw Springs, 8th, Sept. 1781

Served to close of war, died 1830."

The file also contains the standard reply to inquiries from the Assistant to the Administrator, in relevant part, as follows:

"You are advised that it appears from the records of this office that Warrant Number 1096 for three hundred acres of bounty land was issued February 21 1791 to Abisha Thomas, assignee, on account of the services of Joshua Hadley, Captain of the North Carolina Line, War of the Revolution.

"There are no further data as to his service or other data relative to his family, due to the destruction of papers in such claims when the War Office was burned in November, 1800."
