
Bounty Land Claim of Henry Stauffer BLWt1182-100

State of Pennsylvania }
County of Somerset } [3 April 1826]

I, Henry Stauffer aged sixty nine years, do, upon oath, testify and declare, that, in the year one thousand seven hundred and eighty I enlisted for the term of “during the war,” and served in the regiment No. [blank; Armand’s Partizan Legion] under the command of Colonel [Charles] Armand of the Pennsylvania line; and that I continued in the service aforesaid until the close of the war, when I was regularly discharged from the same regiment, commanded by Colonel Armand

I further declare, that I have never received a warrant for the Bounty Land promised to me on the part of the United States; nor have I ever assigned or transferred my claim in any manner whatsoever:
