To his Excellency the Governor of Virginia & the Hon. Council your Petitioner Perses Loveley would most respectfully represent unto your honor that she is the surviving widow and Sole devisee of Captain Wm L Loveley of the Va Continental Line during the war of the Revolution, that said Wm Lewis Loveley never had any children but intermarried with your petitioner in in Va in 1807 and shortly thereafter got the appointment of an Indian ageant and removed in the discharge of his duty to the State of Arkansas and there and many years ago having first made his will giving all his estate to your petitioner & your petitioner would state that she is informed & believes that 4000 acres of land issued to her [undeciphered word] husband by the State of Va & that there is still due in virtue of his services additional land and your petitioner prays that the same be allowed unto her as his divisee & sole heir at law. She states in due time she will file the will & other [undeciphered word] touching the same, and she will [part missing from bottom of page; the following written vertically in margin] & your Petitioner would refer to the evidence on file in the [part missing] on which his original Claim of 4000 acres was allowed [part missing] which shews he entered the Service in March 1776

Sir In reply to your inquiry as to Capt. Wm. L. Lovely of the Virg'a Continental Line I have to state that I have no means of ascertaining the service of this officer. He appears to have received his Commutation.
