Bounty Land Claim of David Cramer BLWt1310-100

Personally appeared before me the subscriber a Justice of the peace in and for said County Casandra Thompson who being by me duly sworn according to Law saith that she is the daughter and an heir at Law of David Cramer de'd a private in General Armonds Legion [Charles Armand's Legion] and that he the said David Cramer died on or about the 15th June 1833 [see endnote]



I Casandra Thompson heir at Law of David Cramer do upon oath testify and declare to the best of my knowledge and belief that David Cramer did enlist in the year 1781 for the term of during the war and served in General Armonds Legion and that he continued in the service of the United States untill the Close of the Rev War I Further declare that I have not received a warrant for the bounty Land promised to him the said David Cramer on the Part of the United States nor do I believe that he ever received it, or Transferred his claim to it in any manner Whatsoever, Therefore [power of attorney follows]

NOTE: Jim Veregge has called attention to the impossibility of the date 15th June 1833 in the first item above, since it is later than the date of the document. The year in the original does appear to be 1833, as shown below, but abstracts of wills for York County PA show that David Cramer's will was dated 28 Dec. 1814 and proved on 21 March 1816.
