[p 2: Printed form of Indent No. 199 Book C dated February 16, 1784 “delivered to Capt. George Liddell of the Third Regiment this our INDENTED CERTIFICATE for the Sum of Nine hundred and forty six pounds, five Shillings and two pence Sterling being for his pay & subsistence to the 1<sup>st</sup> of January 1782 And for his additional State pay to the first day of May 1783 per the Auditor General’s Certificate.”]

[p 3: Reverse of the above Indent bearing endorsements by Hort & Warley. How they acquired an interest in the indent is not disclosed by the documents in this file.]

[p 4: Printed form of Indent No. 1437 Book Y dated August 16, 1786 “delivered to Mr. George Liddell this our INDENTED CERTIFICATE, for the Sum of Thirty nine pounds eight Shillings and eight Pence Sterling for additional State pay due him per Account passed by the Commissioners.”]

[p 5: Reverse of the above Indent bearing only endorsements by Felix Warley who signature appears as follows:

A handwritten signature in cursive script, appearing to read "Felix Warley". The signature is written in dark ink on a light-colored background.

How he acquired an interest in the indent is not disclosed by the documents in this file.]

[Note: The discrepancy in the spelling of the surname of this veteran cannot be explained by the documents in either the federal pension file or in the state Audited Account file. That the documents abstracted above relate to the same officer is, however, without doubt since there was only one officer with the surname of either Liddle or Liddell who served as a Captain in the South Carolina Continental line.]
